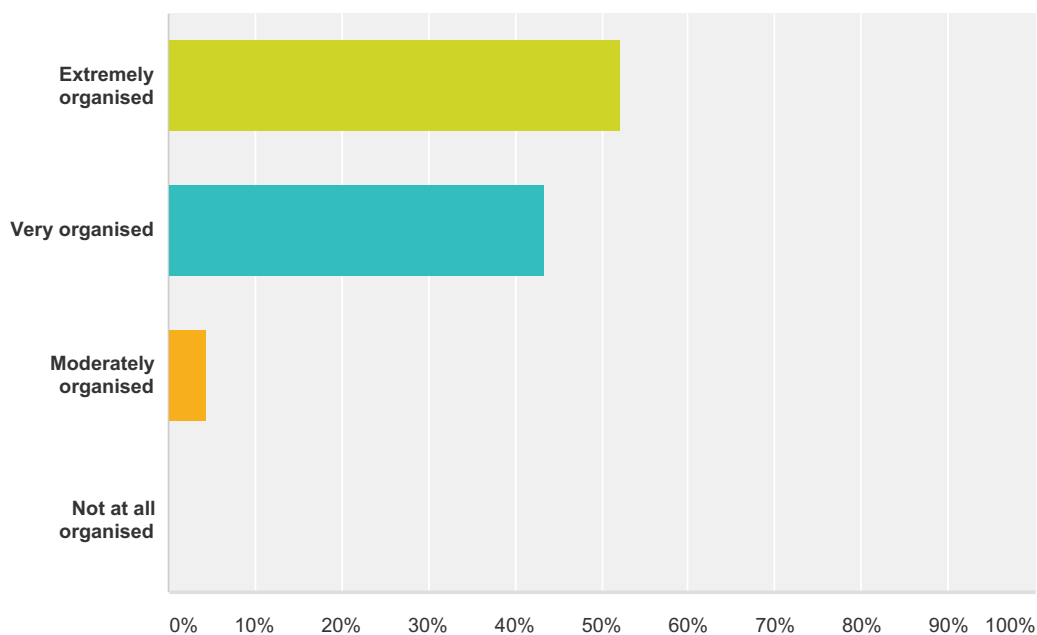

Q2 How well organised was the Conference?

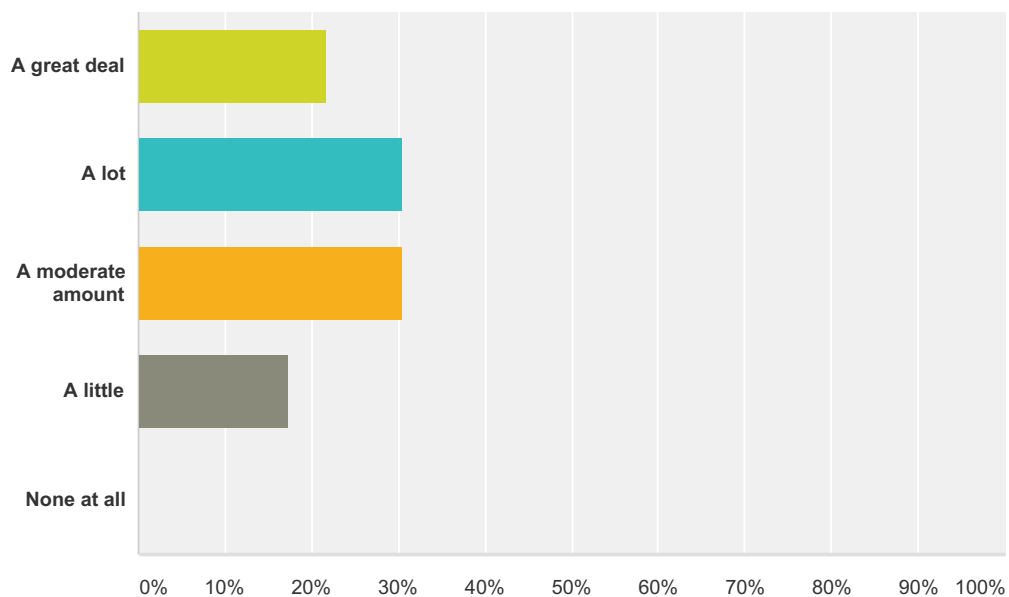

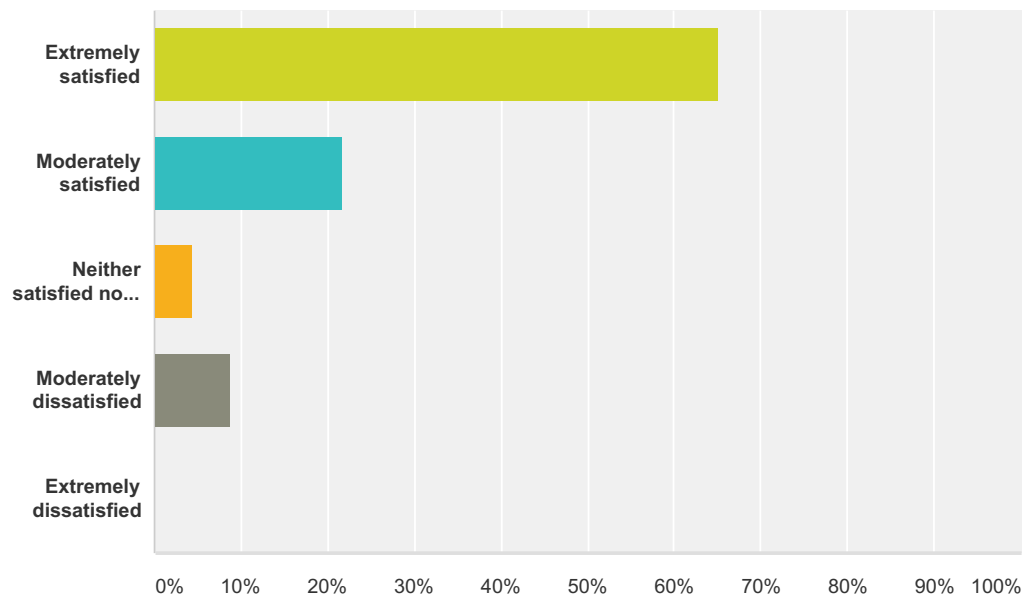
